



SAN JUAN ISLANDS SEA KAYAKERS RENDEZVOUS 2010 - CANOE ISLAND BENEFIT FOR SCHOLARSHIP FUND

August Weekend Rendezvous: August 28-30, Sat-Mon \$160
August Weeklong Rendezvous: August 28-Sept. 2, Sat-Thur \$400 or \$80/night

Grab your sea kayaks and friends, or come by yourself, and enjoy the kayaking opportunities of the San Juan Islands from the comforts of a 47-acre private island. After a day of kayaking, relax in the heated pool or play a game of tennis to loosen up your muscles, eat gourmet meals and share your stories around the fireplace. This program is intended for adults, but those 16 and over can attend with a parent or guardian.

Enjoy the island atmosphere that has made Canoe Island French Camp so popular over the past 40 years, while helping raise scholarship funds for Canoe Island's youth camp programs. One half of your program fee will go directly to the camp's scholarship fund.

The fee includes meals, lodging and use of Canoe Island facilities including the pool, tennis court and sports equipment. Canoe Island food, based on French cuisine, is excellent and nutritious. While three meals will be served on the island daily, those wishing to do full day of paddling can make a sack lunch at breakfast. Lodging will be in the camp's 18' tipis, complete with decks, lights, bunks, and mattresses. Canoe Island can also be your base camp during the weeklong rendezvous: kayak near Canoe Island for a couple of days, then head out for an overnight trip to a farther island, coming back for showers, meals, and shared stories. Pay for just the nights you stay on Canoe Island.

Located in Upright Channel between Lopez and Shaw Islands, Canoe Island is a 4-mile paddle from the Orcas or Friday Harbor ferry landings. Those driving on the ferries can also access Canoe Island from Odlin County Park on Lopez Island (a 1.5 mile paddle to Canoe Island) or from South Beach County Park on Shaw Island (a quarter-mile paddle). If weather conditions allow, some participants may wish to paddle from Anacortes. Non-paddling family members or friends can be picked up and dropped off at the Orcas Island ferry dock with our camp boat.

Participants will plan and lead their own kayak outings. Sea kayak rentals are available in Anacortes and in the San Juan Islands. Canoe Island staff will be available to host you and lead activities on the island. Non-paddling participants who want an introduction to kayaking can use the camp's limited number of kayaks in the calm water close to Canoe Island under the supervision of our instructors/lifeguards. Individual participants may wish to hold informal discussion groups on kayaking topics.
